INTERLOCUTORY ORDER

This matter having been opened to the Public Employment Relations Commission pursuant to N.J.A.C. 19:14-9.1 et seq., by Gerald M. Goldberg, Esq., of Goldberg, Simon & Selikoff, Esqs., attorneys for the Charging Party, and the Commission having delegated to the undersigned the authority to act upon this matter on its behalf, and the undersigned having read the Unfair Practice Charge filed by the Charging Party and the documents and legal memorandum submitted in support of the Charging Party's request for interim relief, and show cause proceedings having been conducted before the undersigned, Mr. Goldberg appearing for the Charging Party and Steven Hoskins, Esq., of the firm of McCarter and English, Esqs., appearing for the Respondent, and John Barbour, Esq. appearing for the New Jersey School Boards Association, amicus curiae, and the undersigned having read the documents submitted in opposition to the request for interim relief, for the reasons more specifically set forth orally and transcribed by the stenographer present at the show cause proceedings, and based upon the facts of this case,


IT IS on this 28th day of April, 1976,

ORDERED that the Respondent, by no later than April 30, 1976, notify in accordance with the provisions of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes pertaining thereto, all non-tenured teaching staff members represented by the Charging Party and who have not been so notified heretofore, that employment for the ensuing year will not be offered, and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that the Respondent, upon demand of the Charging Party, forthwith negotiate in good faith concerning the impact on terms and conditions of employment of unit employees, including but not limited to the procedures to be followed in selecting those unit employees to whom re-employment will not be offered, of the Respondent's decision to reduce its staff in the ensuing year.
