PER CURIAM

Harold Kupersmit, formerly an employee of the State of New Jersey, Division of Taxation, filed a notice of appeal from a "letter memorandum" dated April 11, 1991, from the Public Employment Relations Commission's Director of Unfair Practices declining to reopen appellant's unfair practice charge. Appellant had filed an unfair practice charge pursuant to N.J.S.A. 34:13A-5.4 in February 1990. Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 19:14-2.1, the Director of Unfair Practices declined to issue a

complaint. That decision was contained in a nine-page opinion dated July 17, 1990. Appellant did not appeal from that determination. Instead, appellant now appeals from the commission's decision not to reopen the 1990 proceedings. We have carefully reviewed the record and have considered all of appellant's contentions, and we conclude that those contentions are clearly without merit. R. 2:11-3(e)(1)(D) and (E).

Affirmed.
