3 Time Limits

6. Level two - Board of Education

Life aggrieved person is not retrafted the disposition of his grievance at level one, or of no declared has een rendered broken. Eve (5) school days after the presentation of the grievance, he may fall the grievance in writing with the Association with the five (5) school days after the declared at level one or ten fill a time (5) school days after the declared at level one or ten fill a time days after the grievance was presented, whichever is amongs.

Within five (i) when dees effect to consist who written grievance, the Association shall refer it to the Board of Shitacion for a hearing. A Board hearing shall be granted within fifteen (15) school days after the gracuant's filing for appeal. The Board shall render its decision within ten (10) days after the completion of the hearing.

If after a cooling oif period of ten (10) days the grievence remains unresolved, either party may proceed to subjunction.

7. Arbinration

The embitrator's decision chall be in writing and shall set forth his findings of fact, reasoning and conclusions on the issues submitted. The arbitrator shall be without power or sutherity to make any decisions which require the commission of an act prohibited by law or which is is violation of the forms of this Agreement. The decision of the exhitrator shall be submitted to the Board and the Association and shall be advisory.
- The cost for the services of the embituator, including per dise expenses, if any, and actual and necessary travel, subsistance expenses and the cost of the hearing room whall be borne equally by the Board and the Association. Any other expenses incurred whall be paid by the party incurring same.

C. RIGHTS OF TEACHER TO REPRESENTATION

Teacher and Association

Any aggrieved teacher after level one may be represented at all other stages of the galevance procedure by himself, or at his option, by a representative selected or approved by the Association at no cost to the Board of Education.

2. Meeting and Hearings

All meeting and hearings under this procedure, shall not be conducted in public but shall include only such parties concerned and their designated or solected representatives.

1. Any teacher involved in a grivenous procedure is obliged to Follow administrative directives and board policies while the grievenus procedures are being reviewed.

de Separate Grievance file

All documents, communications and records Jealing with the processing of a griovance shall not be kept in the personal file of any of the particle pants.

ARTICLE THE

ASSOCIATION RECREE AND PRIVILEGES

A. IMPORMATION

The Heard agrees to furnish to the Association in response to tessenable requests from time to time all evertable information concerning the educational program.

8. RELEASE TIME FOR MEETINGS OUTSIDE OF DISTRICT

Association or any Teacher may participate during working hours, in negotiations, griovance proceedings, conferences, or meetings, and shall suffer no loss in pay.

C. USE OF SCHOOL EQUIPMENT AND SACILITYES

The Association shall have the right to use achool facilities and equipment with the approval of the Administrator. The Association shall pay for the reasonable cost of all antachals and supplies incident to such use, and for any repairs necessitated as a result thereof.

D. RELEASE TIME FOR METTINGS INSIDE DISTRICT

Whenever any teacher is mutually scheduled by the parties (HEA/HBE and/or Administrative Principal) to participate during working hours in negotiations, griovance proceedings, conferences or meetings he shall suffer no loss in pay.

ARTICLE 14

TEACHER PERMIS

A. STATUTORY SAVIERS CLRES

Nothing contained herein shall be construed to deny or restrict, to any tracker, such rights as he may have under New Jersey School laws or other applicable laws and regulations. The rights granted to teachers thereunder shall be decided to be in addition to those provided in this Agreement.

B. REQUIRED MEETINGS OR HEARINGS

Or supervisor, Board, or any committee, maker, representative or agent thereof concerning any matter which could edveryely affect the continuation of the teacher in his office, position or exployment or the salary or any increments partaining thereto, them he shall be given prior written notice of the reasons for such meeting or interview and thall be emittled to have a representative of the Association present to advise him and represent him during such meeting or interview. Any suspension of a teacher pending charges shall be with pay. If and when a teacher is found grain, all pay received during the suspension shall be returned to the Board.

C. EVALUATION OF STUDENTS

The teacher shall maintain the caclusive right and responsibility to determine grades and other evaluations of students within the grading policies of the Hamburg School District based upon his professional judgment of available criteria partiment to any given subject area or activity to which he is responsible. No grade or evaluation shall be changed without justification to the teacher.

b. Criticios of Teachers

ANY SECTION

TEACHTHE HEADES AND TEACHTHE LOAD

A. TEACHER DAY

The workday for classions instruction shall consist of not more than six (6) hours and thirty (50) minutes which shall include instructional, perparational, and a duty-free leach period. In addition to the workday for classroom instruction, teachers shall arrive ten (10) minutes before and remain fifteen (15) minutes after the close of the pupil's day. On Fridays or on days preceding holidays or vacation, the teachers' day shall end at the close of the pupil's day whilest otherwise anapunced.

B. LUNCH PERIODS

1. All teachers shall have a daily duty-free lunch period of at least thirty (30) minutes.

2. Leaving the Building

Toachers may heave the building without requesting permission during their scheduled duty-free lanch periods but must inform the office upon leaving and returning.

C. WESTINGS

1 - Prior to Halidays and Machanda

Misnover, possible, another which take place after the regular workday and which require attendance whall not be called on Fridays or on any day amadiately preceding any hullery, or other day upon which teacher attendance is not required at subcost.

2. Paculty

Teachers may be required as common along the end of the regular sankday, without additional companies and, for the gurpose of attending facely meetings. Here weekings what enginess is later than differen (15) minutes after the steaches ding that here

3. Association Right to Speak

An Association representative may speak to the teachers during any meeting referred to in Article V, section C. Far. 2, for a reasonable period of time on the request of the representative.

D. INCLEMENT WEATHER

Teacher attendance shall not be required whenever student attendance is not required due to inclement weather.

E. DEFINITION OF IN-SCHOOL WORK YEAR

The work year shall include days when pupils are in attendance, orientation days, and any other days on which teacher attendance is required.

F. MONITORING DUTIES

The regularly employed teaching staff shall be expected to perform bus, cafeteria, sports activities, dences, playground and concert manitoring duties and these duties will be of equal scheduling as determined by the Administrative Principal. Whenever possible, the scheduling shall be made up at least one month in advance of any duties performed.

G. PREPARATION TIME

Teachers shall have five (5) preparational periods per week, of at least a 30 minute duration, when they shall not be assigned any other duties.

H. TUTORING DUTY

A teacher shall be available when requested by the Administrative Principal to conduct a thirty (50) minute outoring session, a usrismu of one day a week.

2. MOTIFICATION OF CUMTRACT

Teachers shall be notified of these contract and salary status for the sessing year no later than April 50. Teachers shall, in turn, notify the session of their intentions for the empirical year no later than May 15.

C. PLACEMENT ON SALARY SCHEDULE

1. Upon initial appointment, a teacher's salary or placement on the guide shall be negotiated between the Board and the candidate.

2. Adjustment to Salary Schedule

Each returning teacher shall be placed on his proper step of the salary schedule at the beginning of each scadewic year. Any teacher employed prior to February 1 of any academic year shall be given full credit for one (1) year of service toward the next increment step for the following year.

ANTICLE VII

SUBSTITUTES

A. MIST

During the academic year the Board agrees to maintain, to the best of their ability, a list of substitute (eachers.

8. GOVERAGE

The Board shall make every reasonable effort to provide substitutes for all personnel in all departments, including special teachers and nurses.

ARTICLE VILL

TERGIER FACILITIES

A. LISTING OF PACILITIES

During the academic year, the Board shall provide, whenever economically possible, the following facilities:

- 1. Space in each classroom in which teachers may store instructional materials and supplies.
- 2. A serviceable desk, chair and filling cabinet for exclusive use of each teacher.
- 5. Copies, exclusively for each teacher's use, of all texts used in the subject taught by the teacher.
- 4. Needed books, paper, pencils, pens, chalk, chalkboard space and other such materials required in daily teaching responsibility.
- 5. A communication system so that teachers can communicate with mein office from their classrooms.
- 5. Lighted and clean teacher's restroom, separate from the student's restroom.
- 7. Closet space for each teacher to store cost, evershoes and personal articles.
 - 8. Maintained off-street parking facilities

ARTICLE IX

TEACHER ASSIGNMENT

A. NOTIFICATION DATE FOR PRESENTLY EMPLOYED TEACHERS

All teachers shall be given written notice of their class and/or subject assignment; building assignments and room assignments for the forthcoming year not later than July 15, except in cases of emergency.

B. REVISIONS

In the evert that changes in such schedules, class and/or subject assignments, building assignments or room assignments are proposed after July 15, the tracher affected shall be notified promptly in writine and upon the request of the teacher, the changes shall be reviewed between the alministrator and the teacher affected.

C. ASSIGNMENT CRITERIA

In order to assure that pupils are tought by teachers working within their areas of competence, teachers shall only be assigned to teach in areas for which they hold a standard teaching certificate issued by the New Jersey State Board of Examiners.

ARTICLE X

NON-TENURED TEACHER EVALUATION

A. FREQUENCY

1. Frequency

All non-tenured teachers shall be evaluated by the Administrative Principal or his designee at least four (4) times in each academic year. Each evaluation to be followed by a written evaluation and conference between the teacher and the Administrative Principal or his designee for the purpose of identifying and deficiencies extending assistance for their correction and improving instruction.

B. GENERAL CRITERIA

1. Open Evaluation

All monitoring or observation of the work performance of a teacher shall be conducted openly.

2. Evaluation by Certificated Supervisors

Teachers shall be evaluated only by persons certificated by the New Jersey State Board of Examiners to supervise instruction.

3. Copies of Evaluation

A teacher shall be given a copy of any class visit or evaluation report prepared by his evaluators at least one (1) day before any conference to discuss it. No such report shall be submitted to the central office, placed in the teacher's file or otherwise acted upon without prior conference with the teacher. No teacher shall be required to sign a blank or incomplete evaluation form.

4. Standardized Tests

Results of standardized tests used for evaluating students shall not be used to evaluate teacher parformance.

C EVALUATION PROCEDURE

1. Communication

Prior to any svaluation report the Administrative Principal of of teacher shall have had appropriate communication with the teacher which shall include all steps in Par. 7, Article X, Section C of this Agreement.

Z. Novores

Evaluation reports shall be presented to each toacher by the Administrative Principal in accordance with the following procedures:

- a. Such reports shall be issued in the name of the Administrative Principal based on a compilation of reports and observations by any or all supervisory personnel who come fato contact with the teacher in a supervisory expectly.
 - b. Such reports shall be addressed to the teacher.
- portinent:
 - (1) Strongths of the tracher ordenced during the period
 - (2) Weaknesses of the tescher as orlderned during the period alone the provious report
 - (3) Specific suggestions as to measures which the teacher night take to improve his performance in each of the arrest wheats weeknessed have been indicated.

D. PERSONNEL RECORDS

1. File

A teacher shall have the right, upon request, to review the contents of his personnel file and to make copies with Board equipment of any documents contained theris. A teacher shall be entitled to have a representative of the Association accompany him during such review. At least once every three (3) years, a teacher shall have the right to indicate those documents and/or other materials in his file which he believes to be obsolute or otherwise inappropriate. Said documents shall be reviewed by the Administrator or his designee, and if he desires, amendable notes may be added to show changes in the situation.

2. Derogatory Material

- character or personality shall be placed in his personnel file unless the teacher has had an opportunity to review the material. The teacher shall acknowledge that he has had the opportunity to review such material by affixing his signature to the copy to be filed with the express understanding that such signature in no way indicates agreement with the contents theref. The teacher shall also have the right to submit a written answer to such material and his answer shall be reviewed by the administrator or his designee and attached to the file copy.
- b. If a teacher refuses to sign derogatory material, the Administrative Principal shall request that the Association representative and Board representative sign the said material, and said material thall be placed in the file.

3. No Separate File

Although the Board agrees to protect the confidentiality of personnel references, academic credentials and other similar documents, the Board shall not establish any separate personnel file which is not exallable for the teacher's inspection.

E. TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT

Final evaluation of a teacher upon termination of his employment shall be concluded prior to severance and no documents and/or other material shall be placed in the personnel file of such teacher after severance or otherwise than in accordance with the procedure set forth in this ARTICLE.

ARTICLE XI

NOTIFICATION OF FOUR

A. DATE

On or before April 30, the Board shall give to each nontenure teacher continuously employed since the preceding September 30 either:

- 1. A written offer of a contract for employment for the next succeding year providing for at least the same terms and conditions of employment but with such increases in salary and benefits as may be required by law or agreement between the Board and the Association, or
 - 2. A written notice that such employment shall not be offered.

B. REASONS

Any nontenure teacher who receives a notice of non-employment may within five (5) days thereafter, in writing, request a statement of reasons for such nonemployment from the administrator, which statement shall be given to the teacher in writing within five (5) days after receipt of such request.

C. NOTIFICATION OF INTENTION TO RETURN

If the teacher desires to accept such employment, he shall notify the Board of such acceptance, in writing, on or before May 15, in which event such employment shall continue as provided for herein. In default of such notice the Board shall not be required to continue the employatent of the teacher.

D. TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT

Any nontenure teacher who receives a notice that his employment shall be terminated shall be omtitled to a statement of reasons.

ARTICLE XII

EXTENDED LEAVES OF ABSENCE

A. MILITARY

Military leave without pay shall be granted to any teacher who is inducted or enlists in any branch of the armed forces of the United States for the period of said service and three (3) months thereafter, or three (3) months after recovery of any wound or sickness at the time of discharge.

B. HATEWITY

1. Natural Birth

The Board shall grant maternity leave without pay to any temme teacher upon request subject to the following stapulations and limitations:

- a. Maternity leave shall commence and end on the dates requested in writing by the teacher, subject to approval by the Board.
- b. Any tenure teacher granted nateralty leave shall be restored to a teaching position upon written request and approval of the Board.
- c. No teacher shall be prevented from returning to work after childbirth solely on the grounds that there has not been a time lapse between childbirth and the desired date of return; when medical documentation of fitness is provided to the Board.
- d. The Board shall remove any teacher from her duties during prognancy unless the teacher can produce a cortificate from herphysician that she is medically able to continue teaching.
- e. If leave commences prior to May 15th of a given year and the teacher wishes to return to the staff for the forthcoming academic year (same calendar year as when the leave commenced) she must file a written

notice of her intention to return no later than April 15th to the Board.

If this notice is not received by April 15th leave is automatically extended until the beginning of the following academic year. In order to return to the staff for this school year a written notice must be submitted to the Board by April 15th of that same calendar year.

- of this leave will be at the beginning of the following calendar year's academic year. If a teacher wishes to return to the staff for this academic year she must file a written notice of her intention to return no later that April 15th of that some year to the Board.
- g. If a teacher does not wish to return to the staff as described in Article XII, Section B, Paragraph 1, Subsections e and f, the Board shall require a written notice of termination.

C. BENEFITS

All benefits to which a teacher is entitled at the time his leave of absence commences shall be suspended during such leave and shall be restored upon return.

D. EXTENSIONS AND RENEWALS

All extensions and/or renewals of leaves shall be applied for and acknowledged in writing with the approval of the Board.

ARTICLE XIII

VOLUNTARY TRANSFERS AND REASSIGNMENTS

A. MOTIFICATION OF VACANCIES

1. Date

No later than July 1st of each year, the administrator shall make known to the faculty a list of known vacancies.

2. Filing Requests

Teachers who desire a change in grade and/or subject assignment may file a written statement of such desire with the administrator by May 15 of the current year.

3. Written Notification

As soon as practicable, and no later than July 30, the administrator shall notify and deliver to the Association a system-wide schedule showing the names of all teachers who have been reassigned or transferred.

B. CRITERIA FOR ASSIGNMENT

In the determination of requests for voluntary reassignment and/or transfer, the wishes of the individual teacher shall be honored to the extent that the transfer does not conflict with the instructional requirements and best interests of the school system as determined by the Administrative Principal. No such request shall be denied arbitrarily, capriciously, or without basis in fact. If a teacher's request for transfer has been denied, a renewed or subsequent request made in the following academic year shall be granted under the conditions described above, unless there is no available position to which the teacher can be transferred or an adequate replacement for the teacher cannot be obtained.

AUTICLE XIV

MISCELLANGOUS PROVISIONS

A. SEPARABILITY

If any of the Agreement or any application of this Agreement to any employed or group of employees is held to be contrary to law, then such provisions or application chall not be deemed welld and subsisting, except to the extent permitted by law, but all other provisions or applications shall continue in full force and effect.

8. COMPLIANCE BETWEEN INDIVIDUAL CONTRACT AND MASTER AGREEMENT

Any individual contract between the Poeri and an individual teacher, heretofore or hereafter executed, shall be subject to and consistent with the terms and conditions of this Agreement. If an individual contract contains any language inconsistent with this Agreement, this Agreement, during its duration, shall be controlling.

C. PRIVATE NEGOTIATIONS

The negotiations between the Board of Education and the Association shall be conducted in private.

D MODIFICATION

This Agreement shall not be modified in whole or in part by the parties except by an instrument in writing duly executed and minually agreed upon by both parties.

ARTICLE XV

ABSENCE FOR PERSONAL TURNESS

A. DEFINITION

Absence from post of duty because of personal disability due to illness or injury, or because of exclusion from school by medical authorization because of a contagious disasse in the immediate family household.

B. SICK DAYS

All teachers employed shall be entitled to twelve (12) sick days with full pay in each academic year.

C. ACCIMILATION

If fower than twelve (12) school days or allowed sick loave is taken in any academic year, then the number of days not used shall be consulative without limit.

D. ABSENCE ON SICK LEAVE

- 1. Absence on sick leave shall be charged first to the twelve (12) day allowance for the current year until it is fully utilized, and thereafter, to the cumulative credit to the extent that such credit is available to the individual teacher.
- 2. In all absences on sick leave exceeding three (3) consecutive school days, the teacher shall be required to file a physician's certificate with the Administrative Principal apon return. The Administrative tive Principal way require a physician's certificate of illness when sick leave exceeds twelve (12) school days in the academic year.

E. NOTIFICATION OF ACCIDENTATION

A master list of accumulated sick leave of all employees covered by this Agreement shall be forwarded by the Board Secretary to the Association at the beginning of each academic year.

ARTICLE XVI

TEMPORARY LEAVES OF ABSENCE

A. TYPES OF LEAVE

At the beginning of each academic year, teachers shall be entitled to the following temporary nonsecumulative leaves of absence with full pay each academic year:

1. Religious

Upon receipt of a thirty-day notice, up to two (2) days per scademic year for observance of religious holidays, where said observance prevents the teacher from working on said days with the approval of the Administrative Principal.

2. Death

Up to three (3) days at any one time in the event of death of a teacher's spouse, child, parent, father-in-law, mother-in-law, brother and sister.

3. Personal Days

Four (4) days leave of absence for personal, legal, business, household or family matters which require absence during working hours, shall be available. Notification to the Administrative Principal shall be made at least three (3) days before taking such leave (except in cases of emergencies).

B. IN ADDITION TO SICK LEAVE

Leaves taken pursuant to Section A above shall be in addition to any sick leave to which the teacher is entitled.

ARTICLE YVII

HEALTH CARE COVEYAGE

A. New Jersey Blue Cross, Blue Shield, Rider J and Major Medical benefits or its equivalent as autually agreed, for teaching staff members, as described in Article I, and eligible dependents, shall be provided by the Board.

ARTICLE XVIII SALARIES

A. METHOD OF PAYMENT

I. Ten (10) Month

Teachers employed on a ten (10) month basis shall be paid in twenty (20) equal semi-monthly payments on the 15th and last working day of each month.

2. Exceptions

When a pay day falls on or during a school holiday, vacation, or weekend, teachers shall receive their pay check on the last previous working day.

3. Final Pay

Teachers shall receive their final checks on the last working day in June.

4. The salaries of all Personnel covered by this agreement are set forth in Schedule A which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

B. ADDITIONAL CREDITS

- 1. Any regularly employed teacher who has or shall achieve thirty (30) graduate school credits in his field of education beyond the M.A. degree on or before October 31, shall receive \$700.00 in addition to basic salary.
- 2. Any regularly employed teacher who has or shall achieve thirty (30) graduate-school credits in his field of education beyond the B.A. Degree on or before October 31, shall receive \$750.00 in addition to basic salary.
- 3. Any regularly employed teacher who has or shall achieve fifteen (15) graduate-school credits in his field of education beyond the B.A. Degree on or before October 31, shall receive \$375.00 in addition to basic salary.

C. LONGEVITY

- 1. Teachers at the 16th step on the 1977-78 Schedule A Salary Guide, shall receive an additional \$600.00 above the 16th step on the Schedule A Salary Guide 1979-80 during the 1979-80 Academic Year.
- 2. Teachers at the 16th step on the 1978-79 Schedule A Salary Guide shall receive an additional \$300.00 above the 16th step on the Schedule A Salary Guide 1979-80 during the 1979-80 academic year.

C EXTRA DUTY POSITIONS

When the Board and Association mutually agree, the following services shall be offered as extra-duty positions and shall be compensated for at a rate of pay attached hereto and identified as Schedule B. Each teacher performing extra duty shall be placed on the proper step each academic year.

Notification of extra-duty positions shall be posted no later than July 30, service to begin September 1.

D. MID-YEAR SALARY GULDE ADJUSTMENT

The Board agrees to place a teacher on the next salary level with the appropriate salary increase effective February 1, if the teacher earns the required number of credits to be eligible for that level prior to February 1. It is understood that said teacher must submit to the Administrative Principal prior to October 31, 1978, a written notice that he intends to reach the next horizontal salary level by February 1, for the coming academic year.

ARTICLE XIX

PART-TIME STARF MEMBERS

A. DEFINITION

Any Teaching Staff Members whose contract is for less than 100% heaching time (less than 5 days per week).

B. HEALTH CARE PROTECTION

No part-time teaching staff member will have health time protection paid for by the Board except for those part-time teaching staff members hired on or before the 1976-77 contract year or any full time teaching staff member reduced to part-time in the future.

C. SICK LEAVE

This leave will be on a pro-rated basis. (Example - 40% will get .4 x 12% 4.8 or 5 days.)

D. PERSONAL DAYS

This leave will be on a pre-rated basis. (Frample - 40% will get 4 x 400 L.6 or 2 days.)

E. DEATH DAYS

This leave will be on a pro-rated basis. (Example - 40% will get & x 3.4 l.2 or 1 day.)

Article XX

DURATION OF AGREEMENT

A. DURATION PERIOD

This Agreement shall be effective as of July 1, 1978 and shall continue in effect through June 30, 1980.

B. STATUS OF INCORPORATION
