

under the provision of Public Laws of 1974, Chapter 123 of the State of	9

This Agreement entered into the 1st of February, 1984 between the	16
Board of Trustees of Gloucester County College, hereinafter called the	17
Board, and the International Union of Electrical, Radio and Machine	18
Workers, AFL-CIO, hereinafter called the Union, represents a complete	19
agreement between the parties.	20

	GENERAL CONDITIONS	2
1.1	PURPOSE	3
	It is the intent and purpose of the parties hereto to set forth	4
	herein the Agreement covering rates of pay, hours of work and	5
	conditions of employment to be observed by the parties hereto and	6
	to secure closer and more harmonious relations between said	7
	parties.	8
1.2	RECOGNITION	9
	The Board recognizes the International Union of Electrical, Radio	10
	and Machine Workers, AFL-CIO, Local 442, as the exclusive bargain-	11
	ing agent for employees in the custodian, groundsman, maintenance,	12
	and fireman/maintenance categories for the purpose of collective	13
	bargaining in respect to wages, hours and working conditions.	14
	The term "employees" as used in this agreement shall include all	15
	full-time and regular part-time custodian, groundsman, mainte-	16
	nance, and fireman/maintenance personnel but excluding those	17
	employees not specified in the list included in the letter of	18
	recognition dated April 5, 1974.	19
1.3	CONTRARY TO LAW	20
	If any provision of this agreement or any application of this	21
	agreement to any employee or group of employees shall be found	22
	contrary to law, then such provision or application shall be void,	23
	but all other provisions or applications of this agreement shall	24
	continue in full force and effect.	25

	The College shall make available to the Union a bulletin board for	23

	Officers or representatives of the Union (i.e., President,	26 *

to the President of the College or his designee, be admitted to the College during working hours for the purpose of ascertaining whether or not this agreement is being observed by the parties or for assisting in the adjustment of grievances.

2.9 ELECTED INTERNATIONAL UNION POSITION

Any one member of this bargaining unit will be granted a one year unpaid leave of absence to serve in an elected or designated International Union position. Application for such leave must be made at least 45 calendar days prior to the effective date of such leave, and notice of intent to return must be given at least 45 calendar days prior to expected date of return. If notice of intent to return is not received prior to the required date then this shall be understood as resignation.

A maximum total of five (5) unpaid days for convention attendance will be granted each year between July 1 and June 30. No more than one (1) union member may use part of this total aggregate amount of leave at any one time, and application for such leave must be made at least thirty (30) days prior thereto.

	ment from establishing a standard five-day work week other than	8
	Monday through Friday.	9
	Staffing of any other shift will be offered by seniority first per	10
	job category. In the event no one accepts, the least senior	11
	qualified employee per job category will work the required time.	12
3.2	REST PERIOD	13
	All employees will be allowed a fifteen (15) minute break in the	14
	morning and a fifteen (15) minute break in the afternoon as	15
	scheduled by the respective supervisors.	16
3.3	NOTIFICATION OF CHANGE	17
	The Union shall be notified of any proposed changes in the above	18
	working schedule. Any differences or disputes concerning any such	19
	proposed changes shall be handled through the grievance procedure.	20
	Except in unusual circumstances when it cannot be anticipated, a	21
	Union member will be notified at least one week in advance of a	22
	permanent reassignment of duties.	23
3.4	OVERTIME COMPENSATION	24
	All work performed in excess of thirty-five (35) hours and up to	25
	forty (40) hours in the standard work week shall be paid at the	26
	regular straight time rate.	27

All work performed in excess of forty (40) hours or on days other 1 than during a standard work week shall be paid at one and one-half (1-1/2) times the regular straight time rate. All work performed on Board approved holidays shall be paid at two and one-half (2-1/2) times the regular straight time rate. 3.5 NOTICE FOR OVERTIME If overtime is required, the administration will endeavor to give notice of twenty-four (24) hours of overtime requirements and notice of forty-eight (48) hours of requested holiday overtime. However, such notice shall be at least four (4) hours prior to the 10 commencement of an overtime requirement unless agreed to by the 11 employee. 12 No employee shall be compelled to work overtime on holidays. 13 3.6 REPORTING IN 14 Employees who report to work at their regular starting time and 15 have not been given sufficient notice not to report, shall be 16 guaranteed at least seven (7) hours work or pay, except when the 17 inability to provide seven (7) hours work is due to an "act of 18 19 God" beyond the control of the Board. Employees shall be expected to report to work even though the 20 21 College is closed for emergencies or inclement weather (per 814), 22 unless notified to the contrary by the Personnel Office. 3.7 EXCUSED FOR INJURY 23 If any employee is injured in the performance of his/her duties 24 during the course of the work day and requires medical or surgical 25 attention, and is advised by medical personnel or the nurse not to 26 return to work that day, he/she will be paid the balance of the 27

	A. When reducing the work force, the least senior employee within	7
	the job category will be given a two (2) week layoff notice	8
	(except in the case of an act of God) and will be placed up for	9
	disposition.	10
	B. An employee not having sufficient seniority to retain a job	11
	within his/her job category will be permitted to displace the	12
	least senior employee in another job category, seniority permit-	13
	ting, providing the employee can fulfill the requirements of the	14
	job.	15
	C. An employee not fulfilling the requirements of the job as	16
	outlined in above paragraph B will then be laid off and placed on	17

	All employees shall be notified by certified mail, directed to the	20
	address of the employee as stated in the College records, to	21

	Employees on layoff shall be recalled to work prior to Board's	25
	hiring new employees for the jobs open by the layoffs. Employees	26

4.4	SENIORITY FOR UNION OFFICERS	3
	All Union officers employed at Gloucester County College (i.e.,	4
	President and Vice-President of Local 442, Union Chairperson, and	5
	Union Shop Steward of GCC), shall be deemed to have super	6
	seniority insofar as layoffs are concerned during the term of	7
	office to which they are elected. They will be returned to their	8
	regular standing on the seniority list upon termination of office.	9

	Seniority shall cease upon voluntary termination, discharge for	11
	just cause, or failure to return to work when recalled.	12
	The Union Chairperson shall be notified immediately of discharges.	13
	If a grievance is to be initiated because of a discharge, it shall	14
	be processed commencing with Step 2 of the Grievance procedure.	15
	If any discharge for just cause is found to be unfair or discrim-	16
	inatory, the employee shall be reinstated with full seniority	17
	rights and retroactive pay for all time lost, subject to any	18
	agreement made between the Union and the College authorities or	19
	subject to the decision of an arbitrator.	20

	All military leaves shall be dealt with in accordance with appli-	22
	cable Federal and Local regulations.	23
4.7	CHILD REARING LEAVE	24
	Employees of either sex shall be granted unpaid leave of absence	25
	up to one (1) year for care of a newborn child under one hundred	26
	twenty (120) days of age at the time the leave commences (or for	27

an adopted child less than five (5) years of age) provided that where possible at least sixty (60) days prior written notice is given the College. During such leave benefits shall be frozen.

	Vacation time must be taken in the college fiscal year or within	11

5.3	FAMILY ILLNESS	4
	Employees may be absent from work because of a serious illness or	5
	contagious disease among members of the family residing in the	6
	employee's household (family includes father, mother, spouse, and	7
	children). Such time is to be charged against sick leave.	8
5.4	BEREAVEMENT	9
	A paid bereavement leave of four (4) days maximum will be allowed	10
	for each death in the immediate family. Family shall mean:	11
	father, mother, siblings, wife, husband, children, step-children,	12
	grandchildren, grandparents, mother-in-law, and father-in-law.	13
	In the event of the death of a member of the family other than	14
	those previously listed, a Union member may be entitled to one	15
	full day to attend the funeral.	16
5.5	HOLIDAYS	17
	Holidays for the period of this contract shall be determined by	18
	action of the Board.	19
5.6	MEDICAL INSURANCE	20
	The Board shall provide for each employee, after the first two	21
	months of employment, full family coverage under Hospital Service	22
	Plan of New Jersey (Blue Cross, U.C.R. Blue Shield, Rider "J" and	23
	Major Medical).	24
5.7	PRESCRIPTION PLAN	25
	Each employee shall receive Board initiated and funded Blue Cross	26
	of New Jersey Prescription Plan \$1.00 Deductible, Co-Pay).	27

5.8 INSURANCE CARRIER(S)	1
The Board and Union agree to negotiate on the merits of any	2
proposed change in insurance carriers based on the benefits of the	3
proposed plan(s), but not to include compensation for a less	3
expensive plan(s). Such negotiation shall be prior to any effec-	
tive change to a different plan(s).	5
5.9 SUPPLEMENTAL INSURANCE FUND	6
The Board shall contribute \$150 per unit member to an interest	7
bearing fund in 1983-84 and 1984-85. Such supplemental insurance	8
fund shall be jointly administered by the Union designee and the	9
Board.	10
5.10 RETIREE COVERAGE	11
	12
All unit members covered by this agreement on their retirement	13
from the College shall be eligible for all health insurance	14
coverage currently in force at the member's expense and at no cost	15
to the College.	16
5.11 TUITION WAIVER	17
Following the close of registration for both full and part-time	18
students, employees and their dependents will be granted entrance,	19
credit and waiver of tuition and activity fee to any class still	20
open. Dependents shall mean: Spouse and children.	21

Employees may be granted two (2) days personal leave with pay for	23

	The procedure for handling a grievance is outlined below. The	8
	purpose of this procedure is to secure, at the lowest level, an	9
	equitable solution to the claim.	10
