A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF VENTNOR, COUNTY OF ATLANTIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE AN AMENDMENT TO THE FMBA LOCAL 38 CURRENT COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT

**WHEREAS**, The Mayor and City Commissioners have an agreement with the FMBA Local 38; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Ventnor and the FMBA Local 38 wish to amend their current collective agreement as follows:

REPLACE ARTICLE IX, SALARIES, PARAGRAPH I AND J WITH THE FOLLOWING:

New Paragraph I:

Effective January 1, 2017, a Firefighter or Fire Officer serving in the capacity of Fire Inspector or Fire Official and working in the Fire Prevention office on a full-time basis shall receive a stipend to be paid in his/her base pay as follows:

Fire Inspector

Commencement	\$2,500
Start of sixth year	\$3,000
Start of Eleventh year	\$4,000
Start of Sixteenth year	\$5,000

Fire Official

Commencement	\$5,000
Start of sixth year	\$6,000
Start of Eleventh year	\$8,000
Start of Sixteenth year	\$10,000

The City and Local # 38 agree that the positions of Fire Inspector and Fire Official are vital to the safety of the Citizens, Employees, and Tourists in the City of Ventnor.


In the event a Fire Official or Fire Inspector is eligible for a promotion, the fact that they are in the Fire Prevention Bureau shall not be used by the City as a reason for not promoting the employee. However, the City shall not be required to promote any employee and the City reserves the right to determine appropriate staffing levels and assignment of personnel in the Fire Department and Fire Prevention Bureau.

In addition, any firefighter/officer who is licensed as a fire inspector and assigned to perform inspections during their shift shall receive a stipend of \$1,300 per year. The Chief or his designee shall assign up to one firefighter/officer per platoon to perform these additional duties. Payment shall be pro-rated in the event the duties are not performed for a full year.



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
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
