Recognition

The Board agrees to and hereby does recognize the Association as the sole and exclusive negotiating agent for the purpose of collective negotiations in matters relating to terms and conditions of employment on behalf of all employees in the classifications set forth in Appendix "A" attached hereto and made a part thereof.

Grievance Procedure

A. Definition

- 1. A grievance shall mean a complaint by a number of the negotiating unit that there has been to him a moracula loss, injury or inconvenience resulting from a violation, misinterpretation or inequitable application of any of the provisions of this Appendent, Foore policies, or administrative decisions effecting him.
- 2. A grievance to be considered under this procedure must be initiated in writing within thirty (20) calender days from the date when the grievant knew or should have known in the procurerse.
- 3. An "employee grievant" is the percent or percent making the complaint.
- 4. A "party in interest" is the person of a resonant which action of against whom action might be taken in order to resolve the complaint.
- D. Rights of Members to Representation
 - 1. Any party in interest may be represented at all stages of the grievance procedure by himself or at his attion, by a representative of his own choosing. Such a present that we say be one selected or approved by the Association.
 - 2. When an amployee is not represented by the Association in the processing of a grievance, the Association shall at the time of submission of the written grievance to the Superintentant or at any later level, be notified by the Superinten and that the arrivance is in existence and shall be notified of the r sult.

d. Procedure

- 1. (a) Prilure at any step of this problem to examinate the decision on a grievance within the specified tile limits shall permit the employee grievant to proceed to the next step. Failure at any step of this procedure to great a critical to the next step within the specified time higher shall be deemed to be waiver of Au her appeal of the decision.

(Level Two) The employee arievant, no later than tive (5) school days after receipt of the decision of his principal or other immediate superior, may appeal the decision to the Superintendent of Schools. The appeal to the Superintendent must be made in writing specifying: (a) the nature of the principle; (b) the nature and extent of the injury, less, or inconvenience; (c) the results of previous discussions; (d) his discatisfaction with decisions proviously rendered. - 6. A request for arbitration will be honored only if the employee grievant, his representative and the Association whive the right, if any, in writing to submit the metter at issue to any other administrative of judicial tribunal except for the purpose of enforcing the fact-finder's recommendation.
- 7. The following procedure shall be used to secure the services of an arbitrator:
 - (a) Dither party may request the American Arbitration Association to submit a roster of persons qualified to function as an arbitrator in the matter at issue.
 - (b) In the parties are unable to determine a mutually satisfactory arbitrator from the submitted roster, they may request the American Arbitration Association to submit a second roster of names.
 - (c) If the parties are unable to determine within ten (10) school days of the initial request for arbitration, a mutually satisfactory arbitrator from the second submitted roster, the American Arbitration Association may be requested by sither party to designate an arbitrator.
- 8. The arbitrator shall limit himself to the issues submitted to him and shall consider nothing class. In one add notation to, nor subtract anything from the Agreement between the parties, or any policy of the Doard of Education.
 - The arbitrator shall have only the power to interpret what the parties to the AGREEMENT intended by the specific clause in the AGREEMENT or Board policy which is tissue. The recommendations of the arbitrator shall be binding on both parties.
- 9. The costs for the services of the criticator, including per diem expenses, if any, and actual and necessary travel, subsistence expenses and the cost of the hearing room shall be borne equally by the Doard and the Association. Any other expenses incurred shall be paid by the party incurring some.
- D. If any part of the grievance procedure requires the presence of the grievant and/or his chosen representative during any or all of the working day, said person(s) shall suffer no loss of pay, if the grievance is adjudicated in his facer.

Liaison Committees

In each school building a liaison commuter field be easetfished. The purpose of the committee shall be to discuss and implement suggestions for improving services of the departments staffed by respect of the Association and for eliminating possible causes of capt yet resevences. Each committee shall consist of three (3) members of the language form from that building, designated by the members of the Association in the language by representatives of either party and shall be held a sociation of the attime to be mutually determined by the member, of the association.

Rights of the Association

- A. Meetings at work location. On three (3) days notice to the principal of the school or to the person in charge of the work location, the Association representative shall have the right to schedule meetings in the building at a place designated by the Superintendent or his designee for such meetings before or after regular duty hours of the employees involved.
- B. In the event there is no Association representative in any work location, an authorized representative from an ther work location may be designated the authorized representative of the Association by a letter of authorization to the Superintendent, siened by the President of the Association, to carry out all duties and responsibilities of Association representatives as set forth in this Agreement, except that such representative shall not be entitled to leave the premises of the work location in which he works during his working hours.
- Upon proper written application, the Board may grant leave of absence C. without pay to members of the regotiating unit for the conduct of Association business, to attend Association conferences or conventions, or to serve as full-time officers or employees of the Association. To the extent permitted by law, any employee granted such full time leave of absence shall retain all insurance and other benefits and shall continue to accrue seniority for salary increments as though he were in regular service. Upon return to saving such employee shall be placed on the assignment which he or she left or on a similar assignment with all accrued benefits and increments that he or she would have earned had he or she been on regular service. Any employee on such full-time leave of absence shall be permitted to pay both his own and the School District's regular contribution to all plans requiring such contributions, provided the same shall not by contrary to law. Such leaves of absence may not exceed a period of three (I) years, waless extended by the Board upon written application.
- D. There shall be no discrimination addingtonly or player on the basis of race, creed, sex, color, national create or membership activity in the Association. The Association will retriment all employees in the negotiating unit.
- E. A total of 3 business days per year, non-quantative, shall be given to the Association for Association business, to be used at the discretion of the Association, and with prior nation given to the proper supervisor or administrative authority.

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Rights of the Board

The board reserves to itself side windisting and sit sidy over matters of policy and retains the right, subject only to the distributions imposed by the language of this agreement. Salaries and Hours of Work

A. Salary Schedules

The 1975-1976 salaries of all employees covered by this AGPEEMENT are set forth in Appendixes "B" and "C

B. Twelve-month Employees

- 1. The regular work week shall be forly (40) bours. A regular work day shall be eight (8) hours, and the imployee shall have a one helf hour paid lunch period daily.
- 2. While their regular work week to forty (40) hours, chief custodians shall remain responsible for the care and proper operation of the buildings to which they are assigned, unless specifically relieved thereof by written instructions from the business manager. Additional hours of work in any work week required of chief custodians by emergencies or with the approval of the business manager shall be deemed overtime hours and shall be paid in accordance with the applicable provisions of this ARTICLE.
- 3. On days when schools are closed for instructional personnel and pupl but remain open for office and other non-instructional personnel, all custodial and maintenance employees will work their regular shifts.

C Ten-month Daployees

- 1. The regular work week shall be therety five (35) hours. The regular work day shall be seven (7) hours and the employee shall have a one-half hour paid lunch period daily.
- 2. The regular work week of the cochier shall be twenty (20) hours. The regular work day shall be four (4) hours and the employee shall have a fifteen (15) minute break, as a time mutually agreed upon by the food services director and the employee.

D. Overtime Pay

1. Time and one-half time will 'w haid to any twelve-month employee who works in excess of eight (8) hours in a given day or forty hours in a given week.

- 2. Time and one-half time will be paid to any ten-month employee who works in excess of seven (7) hours in a given day or thirty-five (35) hours in a given week.
- 3. Time and one-half time will be paid to any employee covered by this AGREEMENT who works any time on a Sunday.
- 4. There shall be no pyramiding of overtime rates under any section of this ARTICLE.
- 5. Any full-time employee assigned to a vacant position for which he is qualified shall be paid at the pay rate for that position after working three (3) days in that position.

E. Holiday pay

- 1. The following holidays shall be observed as such insofar as possible with time off for all employees for observance. In case the administration finds it necessary for an employee to work on such holiday, his time shall be computed at twice his regular rate for those hours worked on the holiday.

- b. New Year Eve day shall be a 4 hour work day for all members of this unit.
- c. The Board may grant one day with pay for 2 members of the Association to attend the N.J.E.A. Convention. One week prior notice of who will be attending must be submitted to the Superintendent. Proof of attendance by some official document secured at the Convention must be presented to the Superintendent within 3 days of the close of the Convention.
- 3. When any of the foregoing holidays fall on Sunday, the following Monday shall be observed as the holiday.
- 4. An employee is expected to work at regular pay on any other local or religious holiday falling within his regular work schedule. In case of an excused absence for personal observance of such a day, a deduction in the employee's pay at regular tate will be made for such absence.

Vacancies and Transfers

- A. All vacancies caused by death, retirement, discharge, resignation, or by the creation of new positions, chart be publicated within the school district by the Business Administrates as soon as possible.
 - All present employees applying for these vacancies will be given first consideration.
- B. All association member requests for transfer mult be in a written request and if this request is granted or decad, said member shall receive a written notification of the decision.
- C. The Board of Education shall have the authority to transfer employees, whenever in the opinion of the Board, after careful study and consideration, such transfer would insure a more workable, efficient school district operation, and only after the procedure prescribed in Article 9-E has been followed.

Short Term Leaves

A. Personal Business Leave

- 1. All employees covered by this Agreement shall be granted two days absence yearly, with pay, to take core of any emergencies which may arise.
- 2. Personal business leave may be granted for a work day immediately preceding or following a holiday or vacation period, with the express approval of the Superintendent of Schools.
- 3. Request for personal business leave must be submitted 49 hours before personal business leave is to be effective, the Superincendent may approve emergency requests as they arise.
- 4. Only 10% of the unit members may be off or personal business leave on any one day.
- 5. The unused personal business days for each year shall become cumulative and shall be added to the employee's sick leave.

B. Sick Leave

- 1. All employees covered by this Agreement shall be allowed personal sick leave with pay for one day per month for each month of the yearly contract period. (Example: Ten month employees ten days sick leave per year, twelve month employees twelve days sick leave per year).
- 2. Any unused sick leave days shall accumulate without limit from year to year.
- 3. Sick leave days agramulated under the previous officy shall remain valid under this new policy which is in accordance with Thapter 198, Laws or 1954, of New Jersey.
- 4. In case of sickness in the immediate femoly of any employee, and upon the request of the employee to the school superintendent, rick leave may be granted to cover employee's absence because of such illness.
- 5. Extended sick leave will be afforded to employees of the unit. After all accumulated sick leave has been used, then there will be a two-day loss of pay period. Beginning the third day ofter all accumulated sick leave is used, the unit member will receive his daily pay minus the ray of the substitute to replace him. Approval of the extended sick leave will be upon doctor certification of the extended illness and approval by the Board of Education for a period not to exceed ten work days.

C. Death in Family Allowance

All employees covered by this Agreement, in the event of death in the immediate family, shall be granted allowance with pay for attending the death bed or funeral as hereinafter stated:

- 1. An allowance up to five calendar days shall be greated in case of death of any of the following:
 - a. Employee's parents, spouse, children, sensin law, daughter-in-law, and other persons residing as a member of the household of the employee.

- b. Brothers and sisters of the employee and the parents of the employee's spouse.
- c. Legally adopted members of the family and step-relationships as outlined in (a) or (b).
- 2. An allowance of one day shall be manted to attend the funeral of any of the following:
 - a. Uncles, aunts, grandparents and grandonildren of the employee.
 - b. Brothers-in-law and sisters in-law of the employee.

D. Jury Duty

All employees covered by this Agreement was are called on jury duty shall be paid for the time thus lost from regular school duties the difference between their regular pay and their jury pay.

E. Leave of Absence

- 1. A request for a leave of absence submitted by an employee after May 1 for the succeeding school year will not be approved except in an extreme emergency.
- 2. Leave of absence may be granted only to employees who have successfully completed three consecutive calendar years of service in the district, and upon recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools.
- F. Official leave of Absence Without pay due to Illness.

Whenever an employee covered by this agreement is absent due to illness beyond his accrued sick leave, the employee will be automatically placed on official leave of absence without pay until further disposition of the case is taken by the Board of Education.

Tenure

- A. Terms and conditions of employment recarding terms of employees in the unit covered by this Agreement shall be governed by the previsions of this Article and applicable 1 w.
- B. Before being appointed as a regular employee, and newly appointed custodian, matron, or maintenance employee unlike employed on a year to year basis for the first three years.
- C. The new employee will be evaluated at the end of carb four (4) month period.
- D. At the end of the three (3) year period, of the redividual has proven satisfactory, he will then be employed permunently. If during the first three (3) year period the employee is not performing satisfactorily, he can be released at the end of any evaluation period.
- E.1. Employees shall receive written reports of all evaluations and may request a conference to discuss such evaluation with their superior, and shall be afforded the right to repond to any adverse evaluation in writing. Said written response thall be attached to and shall become part of said evaluation.
 - 2. Any employee given an adverse evaluation chall be given a period of 30 days to improve the deficiency, at the end of which time a second evaluation shall be made.
- F. Each member of the unit will receive a performance review by May 1 of each year, covering areas other than set forth in their job description. Performance reviews will be carried out by each building administrator. Performance reviews on maintenance percental, grounds keeper, and others not assigned a specific building will be carried out by the Director of Maintenance and Operations.

Insurance Protection

The Board shall provide health-care incurrence or testion for each employee in the unit covered by this agreement. Vacations

The Board and the Association agree that veration benefits for employees covered by this AGREEMENT shall include and shall be familed to the following:

- A. Annual vacations based on seniority shell be taken at a time approved by the Superintendent of Schools. The vacuum ion time carned during a contract year may be held over up to August 31 of the next succeeding contract year, however, up to two neeks of said vacation time may be banked indefinitely for future use, noticit is tanding the August 31st termination date.
- B. An employee the dies before his contract period is completed shall receive full recognition of his vacation rights. If an employee retires on or after his anniversary date of employment during the contract period, he will be entitled to the regular vacation he would have received under section "C" below, had he worked the full contract period. Such vacation rights, unless decided otherwise by the retirce, shall be an extension of employment beyond the effective date of official retirement.

Workers who work between the hours of 3 p.m. and 12 midnight will receive a \$.15/hour differential pay.

A service increment of \$200 shall be granted to an employee upon commencing his/her twenty first (21), twenty sixth (26) and thirty first (31) year of employment in the school district.

APPENDIX C

SALARY SCHEDULF FOR TEN-MONTH LMPLOYERS

- A. The salary schedule which follows is adopted by the Board of Education and is applicable to full-time chi recoke, cafeteria workers and cashier.
- B. Each individual is to be placed on his or her proper place on the salary schedule on the effective date of only 1, 1977.
- C. All employees with an honorable discourse from the United States Armed Service will be given additional credit for full service to meanest calendar year up to maximum of four (4) years.
- D. All employees working during the months of July and August shall be paid the straight time rate on the salary schedule effective July 1 of the same year
- E. The position of four (4) hour per day cashier requires that she must work two years to move the next higher step on the salary schedule.
