## TOWNSHIP OF HAMILTON AND NEW JERSEY STATE POLICEMEN'S BENEVOLENT ASSOCIATION, MAINLAND LOCAL No. 77 SGT UNIT) COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT

- Whereas, a the parties are subject to a collective bargaining agreement effective January 1, 2017 through December 31, 2019;
- Whereas, the Parties have mutually agreed to a contract extension through good faith negotiations;
- Whereas, the following amendments shall be incorporated into the current collective bargaining agreement.
  - 1. The PBA agrees to change the base health insurance plan to the State Health Benefits Direct 2030 plan effective January 1, 2020.
  - 2. Officers shall be eligible to select any greater SHBP coverage but will be 100% responsible for any price increase. Officers shall pay Chapter 78 contributions based on the Direct 2030 plan cost and the full premium difference between the selected plan and Direct 2030.
  - 3. Officer contributions to health insurance pursuant to Chapter 78, year four rates and shall be based on the SHBP Direct 2030 premiums.
  - 4. The term of the contract shall be January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2022.
  - 5. The salary guide for the contract extension shall be as follows.

6. The clothing allowance under Article XXIV shall be as follows:

- 7. The 12-Hour Shift memo shall be incorporated into the contract.
- 8. The Contract shall include a provision that provides that any out of county training which is scheduled to last eight hours shall count as a full shift worked for 12 hour employees.
- 9. All other proposal of the parties are hereby withdrawn.
- 10. All other terms of the prior collective bargaining agreement shall remain in full effect.
- 11. This agreement is subject to ratification by the PBA as well as the Township Council.
