### AFSCME LOCAL 2287

### AMENDMENTS TO THE 1973-1976 LABOR AGREEMENT

### FOR PAY PURPOSES ONLY

- 1. a) The Anniversary Date for all employees covered by this agreement who were hired prior to January 1, 1976 shall be January 1 of each succeeding year.
  - b) The Anniversary Date for all employees covered by this agreement who were hired on or after January 1, 1976 shall be one year from date of hire for each succeeding year.
- 2. The 1976 pay ranges for all job classifications covered by this agreement are set forth in Appendix "A" attached.
- 3. All employees covered by this agreement who have a January 1 anniversary date will receive an across the board salary increase based upon their annual salary as of December 31, 1975 retroactive to January 1, 1976 as set forth below:
  - a. 1975 annual salary 0 \$10,000: 6 percent on their annual base to a maximum of \$600.
  - b. 1975 annual salary \$10,001-\$15,000: \$600 plus 4 percent of the difference on their annual base over \$10,000 to a maximum of \$200.
- Those employees covered by this agreement who were hired prior to January 1, 1973, and received promotional title changes during the period January 1, 1973 through December 31, 1975 will receive the 1976 pay package set forth above calculated on the maximum of their promotional title in effect as of December 31, 1975. (Appendix "B")
  - b) Those employees covered by this agreement who were hired prior to January 1, 1973, and as a result of promotional title changes received during the period January 1, 1973, through December 31, 1975 have a current annual salary lower than the annual salary they would have had, had they not received a promotional title change, will be brought to the maximum of the salary range of their former title and will receive the 1976 pay package set forth above calculated on the maximum of their promotional title in effect as of December 31, 1975. (Appendix "C")

- 5. The County agrees to provide a \$1 co-payment prescription drug plan for all employees covered by this agreement.
- 6. Employees having completed five (5) years of continuous service will have added to their gross per annum pay an additional \$200, commencing with the first day of the first full pay period following said anniversary of hire, and for the completion of each additional five (5) years of service calculated in the same manner using employee anniversary dates, shall have added to their gross per annum pay, an additional \$200.
- 7. The County agrees to provide payment for accumulated sick time at the time of retirement of an employee covered by this agreement to a maximum of \$12,000 in accordance with the existing New Jersey State Plan.
- 8. The County agrees to eliminate and upgrade the job classification for "Tree Climber" to "Senior Tree Climber" with a salary range of \$7,440-\$11,657. All incumbents serving in the upgraded titles will receive a salary increase for 1976 in accordance with 3a and 3b above.
- 9. The County agrees to provide uniforms as set forth below to all full time employees working in the following job classifications at Donnelly Memorial Hospital:

  Stationary Fireman, Stationary Engineer, Carpenter, Gardner, Plumber, Painter,
  Senior Maintenance Repairman, Maintenance Repairman, Senior Building Maintenance
  Worker, and Laborer.

Two Winter Uniforms - Two pants, Two Shirts

Two Summer Uniforms - Two Pants, Two Shirts

Two Jackets - One Eisenhower, One three-quarter with hood

and one Eisenhower jacket liner.

One Pair of Safety Shoes

To be replaced annually:

One Set Winter - One Pants, One Shirt
One Set Summer - One Pants, One Shirt

Shoes and Jackets will be replaced as needed at the discretion of the Department Supervisor.

10. The County agrees to provide one uniform and one pair of shoes to all full time employees working in the following job classifications at the Donnelly Memorial Hospital for calendar year 1976 only: Barber, Butcher, Cook, Hospital Attendant, Physical Therapy Aide, Recreation Therapy Aide, Seamstress, Senior Cook, Senior Food Service Worker, Senior Laundry Worker, Senior Recreation Therapy Aide, Senior Seamstress, Truck Driver, Senior Linen Room Attendant, Ward Clerk, and Senior Building Service Worker.
