#### MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

This AGREEMENT is reached between the Mainland PBA Local #77 (Egg Harbor Twp) (hereinafter referred to as "the PBA") and the Township of Egg Harbor (hereinafter referred to as "the Township") for the purpose of achieving a resolution to the anticipated economic shortfall besetting the Township for the 2011 year as pro-rated and related to the Township's Police Department (\$100,000). It is acknowledged by the parties that this concession (\$100,000) is in addition to the \$100,000 overtime concession made by the PBA during the first quarter of 2011. The terms of this AGREEMENT have been approved and adopted by the Township's governing body and approved and ratified by the PBA. The terms of this AGREEMENT are set forth below and if applicable, will supersede the current contractual language for the remainder of the 2011 calendar year.

- 1. The parties agree to the following:
  - a. <u>Clothing Allowance</u> The 2011 amount budgeted for Clothing Allowance is \$84,600.
     \$61,600 shall be utilized to meet the contractual obligation while \$23,000 shall be utilized by the Township towards the \$100,000 concession amount.

#### SAVINGS = \$23,000

b. <u>Tuition Reimbursement</u> - The 2011 amount budgeted for Tuition Reimbursement is \$96,600. \$69,600 shall be utilized to meet the contractual obligation while \$27,000 shall be utilized by the Township towards the \$100,000 concession amount.

SAVINGS = \$27,000

c. Overtime - The 2011 amount budgeted for overtime is \$400,000. \$100,000 was given back to the Township for the period 1/1/11 - 4/1/11. Of the remaining \$300,000, \$250,000 shall be utilized effective April 1, 2011 to meet the contractual obligation (paid overtime) while \$50,000 shall be utilized by the Township towards the \$100,000 concession amount. Once the remaining \$250,000 payment for overtime is utilized, officers would receive compensatory time for the remainder of the 2011 year.

#### SAVINGS = \$50.000

- 2. The parties agree that paid overtime shall continue for any detail that is reimbursed to the Township by an outside employer, agency, grant, or state or federal program.
- 3. The Township agrees that based upon the terms of this Agreement, it has no plans to lay-off any police officers.
- 4. The parties agree that if the Township should institute any lay-offs in the police department during the 2011 year, the terms of this Agreement shall become null and void and all officers shall be made whole for any and all concessions granted pursuant to this Agreement.
- 5. The Township shall provide when requested by the PBA, documents and/or worksheets that show the economic state of the Township.
- 6. The parties agree that should additional lay-offs or other budget reductions become necessary during 2011, the parties will meet and discuss possible alternatives and/or resolutions prior to the implementation of any actions by the Township having an adverse effect on police officers.

#### MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

This AGREEMENT is reached between the Mainland PBA Local #77 (Egg Harbor Twp) (hereinafter referred to as "the PBA") and the Township of Egg Harbor (hereinafter referred to as "the Township") for the purpose of achieving a resolution to the anticipated economic shortfall besetting the Township for the 2010 year as pro-rated and related to the Township's Police Department (\$750,000). The terms of this AGREEMENT have been approved and adopted by the Township's governing body and approved and ratified by the PBA. The terms of this AGREEMENT are set forth below and if applicable, will supersede the current contractual language for the remainder of the 2010 calendar year.

- 1. The parties agree modify Article XXI, Paragraph A.1 by adding the following:
  - a. Notwithstanding the above, for the remainder of the 2010 calendar year only, all employees covered by this Agreement agree that upon the effective date of the signing of this Memorandum of Agreement, instead of being paid one and one-half (1 ½) times their straight time hourly rate, they will receive one and one-half (1 ½) hours of compensatory time for every hour of overtime worked as defined in this Article. This shall be known as compensatory time and not confused with Kelly time. This compensatory time shall be maintained by the Employer in a separate account.
  - Employees may not accrue more than 480 hours of compensatory time, this represents
     320 hours of actual overtime work.
  - c. Employees will attempt to use their compensatory time within a "reasonable period" so long as its use does not "unduly disrupt" the operations of the police department. However, the Employer shall not use any means to coerce or regularly schedule an employee to use their accumulated compensatory time.

- (1) "Reasonable period" for the purpose of this Article shall mean the customary work practices within the police department, including but not limited to (a) the normal schedule of work, (c) anticipated peak workloads based on past experience, (c) emergency requirements for staff and services, and (d) the availability of qualified substitute staff;
- (2) "Unduly disrupt", for the purposes of this Article shall mean the inability of the police department to provide services or acceptable quality and quantity for the public during the time requested without the use of the employee's services. However, mere inconvenience to the Employer is an insufficient basis for denial of a request for compensatory time off, but the employer may deny a request for compensatory time if the granting of the request would cause overtime;
- d. Employees who are unable to use or select to use only a minimal amount of their accrued compensatory time shall be able to carry said time forward, as long as they do not exceed the maximum set forth in Paragraph b.
- e. The parties agree for the calendar year 2010 that they will suspend the provisions set forth in Article XXI, Paragraph A (2).
- Officers who provide written notice to the Township to retire by December 31, 2010 shall
  continue to earn compensatory time for overtime worked but any earned and accumulated
  compensatory time will be paid to them at their current rate of pay upon retirement.
- The parties acknowledge and affirm that the current practice of the Township's police department for requiring overtime shall continue and not be modified due to the PBA's agreement to forego paid overtime for compensatory time.

- 4. The parties agree that paid overtime shall continue for any detail that is reimbursed to the Township by an outside employer, agency, grant, or state or federal program.
- 5. The PBA agrees that all officers shall have their actual salary (base & longevity) frozen at the level in effect on December 31, 2009 for the 2010 calendar year.
- 6. Any officer who has received an incremental increase prior to the signing of this Agreement shall not be required to reimburse such amount to the Township but will have his/her salary adjusted prospectively to the December 31, 2009 amount.
- 7. As of 11:59 p.m. on December 31, 2010, all employees shall be placed on the proper step of the 2010 salary guide as though they had progressed through the guide with the normal progression.
- 8. The parties agree that in the event any contribution towards health insurance is mandated by the State of New Jersey, any current contractual obligation for contribution toward health insurance shall be considered null and void and expire the day prior to the implementation date of the State's mandate.
- 9. The Township agrees that based upon the terms of this Agreement, it has no plans to lay-off any police officers.
- 10. The parties agree that if the Township should institute any lay-offs in the police department during the 2010 year, this terms of this Agreement shall become null and void and all officers shall be made whole for any and all concessions granted pursuant to this Agreement.

- 11. The Township shall provide when requested by the PBA documents and/or worksheets that show the economic state of the Township. In particular, the Township agrees to show the status of workers' compensation payments and/or savings, grant awards, changes in state and/or federal aid and any changes in the employment status of any law enforcement officer.
- 12. The PBA agrees to withdraw without prejudice its pending Unfair Labor Practice Charge against the township (Docket No. CO-2010-245)
- 13. The parties agree that should additional lay-offs or other budget reductions become necessary during 2010, the parties will meet and discuss possible alternatives and/or resolutions prior to the implementation of any actions by the Township having an adverse effect on police officers.
- 14. The terms of this Memorandum of Agreement shall cease on December 31, 2010 with the exception of the terms included in the Amendment to the Agreement.

#### HEALTH BENEFITS

A. Add the Following Sentence to the Paragraph:

#### MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement is reached between the Mainland PBA Local No. 77 and the Township of Egg Harbor for the purpose of achieving a comprehensive resolution to the economic shortfall besetting the Township of Egg Harbor as pro-rated to the Township's Police Department. The terms of this resolution, have been approved and adopted by the Township's governing body and ratified by the PBA membership and are in lieu of any reduction in force of police officers and or demotion in rank. The terms of this Agreement are set forth below and if applicable, will supersede the current contractual language for the remainder of the 2010 calendar ONLY.

- The parties agree to suspend ALL payments under Article XXVIII CLOTHING ALLOWANCE of their current Collective Bargaining Agreement. The suspension of these payments shall be effective June 4, 2010 at 1800 hours through December 31, 2010.
- 2. The parties agree to suspend the option of selling back Kelly Time as outlined in the Side Bar Agreement of December 31, 2008, Article XXXVI paragraph "E" for 2010 ONLY. All Kelly Time earned in 2010 and not used in 2010, Must be used prior to January 1, 2013. In addition, should an officer retire prior to January 1, 2013 and have unused Kelly Time from 2010, such time must be used prior to retirement or used as Terminal Leave.
